This Board has no resources of their own to meet this extra financial commitments. The proposal is not recommended further.

3. The Cantonment Board is already employing a part-time C.P.C. for preparing plans and setting of Cantonment Fund Buildings. He would be too busy in his own work and cannot be wholly employed. 22. To consider Cantonment Executive Officers Report pointing out the practice of accumulating the garden refuse (leaves of trees, branches and grass) and placing it in the dust bin. This practice entails an extra work on the Cantonment Conservancy Truck, with the result that the daily normal sanitary work is greatly handicapped and remains unremoved. The garden refuse should as a matter of fact be burnt locally.
