

PROCEEDINGS OF THE MEETING OF CANTONMENT BOARD, DACC A CANTONMENT  
HELD ON 15TH APRIL 1961 AT 09-00 HOURS IN THE 14 DIV. DACC CANT.

1. To note the statement of monthly account for the month of March, 1961, compiled in accordance with Rule 90 of the Pakistan Cantonment Account Code, 1955. The accounts circulated to all members.

RESOLUTION : Noted. The deposit of Rs.30,000.00 for construction of two rooms, Cantonment Modern School, Rs.1,405.00 for repairs of Cantonment Market and Rs.624.00 for white washing and repairs to Double Storied Building in favour of M.S are also noted. The GOC and the President impressed the desirability of immediate construction of the room in the school.

2. To consider Sanitary Report on Dacca Cantonment for the month of April, 1961.

RESOLUTION : Noted. The President again stressed that he had taken a final decision to the effect that B.I. Industries should be shifted from the present site as its existence is not only illegal but undesirable from other angles. The suggestion of offering an alternative site in the proposed bazar area was motivated by humanitarian consideration otherwise legally a temporary illegal licensee like the Industry had no right to this. Whatever he did it was with open eyes and clearly understanding that his licence was purely temporary. The Executive Officer informed the President that final notice had been given and date of shifting also fixed in accordance with the orders but the Ministry of Defence issued a stay order requiring the Board to pend all action regarding shifting. The Executive Officer also intimated to the President that again in accordance with his orders the proposal for lease in the new Saddar bazar area had also been sent to Ministry of Defence. The President directed that this being a spot decision by him, the Ministry of Defence be asked by signal to cancel their stay orders and thereafter action be taken to shift the Industry. Otherwise again the period covered by the renewal fee will expire in October 1961 and then the C.E.O. had no legal power to accept renewal fee of the temporary licence as has been illegally done in the past. Then the C.E.O. will be legally bound to confiscate these structures and put this to public auction. There being no provision in the C.L.R. Rules either to extend the period of licence in favour of the same person or allow the structures to remain after date of expiry. Therefore, to maintain and prolong an illegal situation like this makes the statutory land rules farcical and the Ministry of Defence must be aware of this.

3. To consider Station Headquarter's letter No. 316/7/G dated 1-4-61 suggesting cancellation of the Profession Licence in respect of Pan-Biri Vendors at Staff Road for reasons of security and sanitation measures.

RESOLUTION : Cancellation is not necessary. They should be shifted near the Cinema.

4. Reference Cantonment Board Resolution No. 2 dated 6-8-60.

To consider HQ PAF letter No. HQEP/825/1/Ed dated 30.3.61 requesting grant of a receiving grant-in-aid of Rs.750.00 per month for PAF School (File CBD/Genl/235 page 5).

RESOLUTION : Approved. Obtain sanction of the Ministry of Defence for payment of this grant-in-aid to the PAF Primary School, provided the School will be opened to inspection by the Officers of the Board.

5. Reference Cantonment Board Resolution No. 3(ii) dated 22-3-61. To consider the programme in respect of the work of construction of two rooms by the Garrison Engineer (Maintenance). Attention is invited to Cantonment Executive Officer's note with President's order.

RESOLUTION : The President again asked the G.L. (Maintenance) to commence work as speedy as possible.

6. Reference Cantonment Board Resolution No. 7 dated 22-3-61. To consider Scheme for grant of freeship and half freeship for Cantonment Modern School and also orders of the President on the joint inspection notes by DDML&C and C.E.O.

RESOLUTION : (a) Have it vetted by G-1 and thereafter place before the Board.

(b) The report of the joint inspection of the Cantt Modern School by the DDML&C and CEO was also considered. The orders accorded by the President vide HQ 14 Div. letter No. 201/6/Edn dated 14-4-61 be implemented forthwith as under :-

(i) The principle of employing 100% trained staff is approved. The existing staff should be encouraged to obtain training and in case of probationers they should not be confirmed until they obtain training.

(ii) The present grades of pay commencing from Rs. 150.00 and Rs.175.00 do not attract carrier and trained hands. These should be abolished and replaced by the undermentioned grades:-

Matric J.V.	150-10-200 EB 20 -250.
Trained teachers for nursery & K.G.	

B.A. B.Ts.	200-20-300 EB 25 -350
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M.A. B.Ts.	250-25-350 EB 30 -410
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(iii) There are 13 classes and only 16 teachers to man them. Further more from July 1961 7th Standard or IX Classes will come into existence. Naturally in the establishment consisting of ladies there are frequent cases of absence on leave from natural causes maternity etc. and the existing strength is, therefore,

after  
not only insufficient but classes remain unlooked/for long  
periods. The strength should be increased to 19.

(iv) One Clerk is insufficient for ~~existing~~ School office and  
therefore another clerk in the scale of Rs.80-5-180-6-190 be  
employed forthwith under Rule 9 of the Pakistan Cantt Servants  
Rules 1954 and sanction of the Ministry of Defence be obtained  
in the usual course.

(v) A Duplicating Machine should be purchased at once for ~~xx~~  
cyclostyling examination papers etc.

(vi) The President has already sanctioned purchases of two buses  
from G.O.C's Education Fund and orders have been placed with  
Lt. Col. Jacob, Director of Transport.

7. To consider sanction to construction of Golf Building  
Dacca Cantonment in accordance with Section 179 of the Cantts.  
Act, 1924.


RESOLUTION : The plan is not signed by the Secretary of the Club

above are removed.


8. To approve the Budget Estimates for the year 1961-62
