RESOLUTION : The statement of monthly account with the list of expenditure and the petrol account as placed on the table is approved.

2. To consider Government of Pakistan Ministry of Defence letter No. 55/15/3/7-6/10H dated 28th March 1956, regarding the request, to Mr. S. Khan, Board Clerk, of PCF of the Sanitary Inspector viz. Mr. J. under Budget of the Sanitary Inspector for performing the additional duties of the Sanitary Inspector. Budget provision under head ~~III-K~~ of the current year's Budget for the payment of the allowance of Rs. 2500/- per month.

3. To peruse Government of Pakistan Ministry of Defence letter No. 29/15/33/D-5/L.C.H. dated 16th May 1956, about the appointment of a trained Sanitary Inspector and also the present incumbent Mr. A.K.A. Majid appointing him only for six months.

RESOLUTION : Read and noted. Resolved that the Sanitary Inspector, Mr. A.K.A. Majid, appointed temporarily, should execute a contract for six months. In the meanwhile the post should be re-advertised to obtain the services of a suitable and qualified Sanitary Inspector.

4. To consider resignation of Mr. Abdul Qudus, temporary teacher dated 16-5-56. The teacher has not joined the school after Ramzan Holiday's on 17-5-56 without giving any prior notice.

RESOLUTION : Noted. The note of the Cantonment Executive Officer is noted and approved. The Board agrees that cases of indiscipline should be severely dealt with.

The pay of the unit school teachers were fixed and approved by Government under their letter No. 143/5/G/1/D-5/52/LCH dated 18-8-54 (para 2), and further increase of Rs. 5/- has been recommended by the Board. Untrained teachers cannot claim the pay of trained teachers, and such untrained teachers must be employed on temporary basis.

5. To consider Cantonment Executive Officer's report pointing out to the Board that :-

- (i) the post of an I.A., trained teacher sanctioned for coaching the students of the newly introduced class VI ; was advertised but no trained teacher was available.
- (ii) Only one application from an untrained I.A. lady teacher has been received for the new Nursery section against the advertisement. The District Inspector of Schools and the Regional Employment Exchange have also been written to send the name of a suitable candidate. The Station Commander, vide his letter No. 200/7/x/a dated 9-5-1956 has allotted a quarter for the purpose which is being taken over. There is no furniture nor educational appliances required for Kindergarten type of education.

RESOLUTION :

*Noted. Further efforts should be made to procure the teachers. Through the employment exchange. Furniture for the new Kindergarten class should be purchased after getting quotations. The furniture should be put up after purchase of fuel for Rs 500/- by Mr. ...*

6. To consider the report of the Assistant Engineer and Cantt. Executive Officer, about the final siting of the Cantonment Board Primary School building as per plan placed on the table.

RESOLUTION : Noted and confirmed.



7. To consider the question of writing off Demand as per Register of Demand & Collection for the year 1955-56, in the case of Hawkers who left the station.

RESOLUTION : The arrears of Rs. 656/- from 47 Hawkers as per list placed on table, is due to the yearly, instead of monthly demand raised against these hawkers in the Demand Register. As the Hawkers left the station and not traceable in the Cantonment from the date mentioned in the Register, the demand has to be deleted against them for the remaining months. Out of Rs. 722/-, Rs. 66/- has been recovered from 5 hawkers who evaded the payment and are still working in the Cantonment. The amounts mentioned in the list, as irrecoverable are, therefore, written off under Section 102 of the Cantonments Act, 1924. In each individual's case, the amount is below Rs. 50/-.

In future only monthly demand, in accordance with the Professional tax notification should be raised and a list of hawkers approved every month, duly certified by the Sanitary Inspector, that, they are working in the Cantonment limits.

8. To consider application dated 23-5-56, submitted by the Head Clerk stating his inability to furnish cash security, for the due discharge of the additional duties of Accountant-cum-cashier; and requesting the Board to accept a fidelity insurance policy issued by an Insurance co. approved by the Government vide rule 42, clause (2)(e) of the Pakistan Cantonment Servants Rules, 1954. Ordinarily at one time the cash handled is NOT more than Rs. 100/-.

RESOLUTION : Resolved that a fidelity insurance policy by a company approved by the Government be taken to cover the risk. The premia for the policy to be paid by the Board and deducted from the pay vide rule 42(4) of the Pakistan Cantonment Servants Rules, 1954. *The sanction of Govt in this procedure should be obtained.*

9. To consider the Annual Administration report of the Dacca Cantonment for the year 1955-56.

RESOLUTION : Approved. The report should be submitted to ~~the~~ Government.

10. To peruse Government of Pakistan Ministry of Defence letter No. 92/1/G/D-5/54 dated 26-4-56, entitling Cantonment Servants and their families to facilities of Medical Attendance and treatment in accordance with the provision contained in Rule 62 of the Pakistan Cantonment Servants Rules 1954.

RESOLUTION : Read and noted. The draft reply as placed on the table is approved and should be forwarded to the Ministry of Defence.



(12) To consider letter no 29/91<sup>III</sup>/5-1 D-5 LCH. Dated 31st May 1956, about C.B. precedents <sup>regarding</sup> ~~and~~ accounts of Class IV servants.

Resolution: It is <sup>not</sup> possible to take any authority for free accounts of Class IV servants, from the Comptroller and Auditor General, but it is well known that all Class IV servants are entitled to free accounts. The Board recommends that this concession should also be extended to all Class IV Band servants. The Class IV servants of the Band are getting much lesser pay than that payable to the members of this Commission is all the more necessary. At present, only 4 Class IV servants out of the entire establishment have been given temporary B.A. certificates, and these are still working away from Comptroller.

12. To Consider Annual Inspection Report on the Dacca Cantonment for the year 1955-56 received under Government of Pakistan Ministry of Defence letter No. 21/M/55/16/D-5/LCH dated 1st June 1956 put up together with the draft replies.

RESOLUTION: Read and noted. The draft replies as placed on the table, are approved and be forwarded to the Ministry of Defence.

(ii) As there are now 6 classes of Bengali students both, hence <sup>as</sup> one teacher for each is the employer, sanction for 12 teachers at B 80/9/130-6-190, with the pay of 1477. at 180-10-300 should be applied for. The school run as permanent school.

13. To consider the monthly Sanitary Report for the month of May '56 vide Section 129 of the Cantonments Act, 1924.
