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2. To read and consider the monthly Sanitary Report for the month of January 1955.

RESCLUTION: Read and noted. Action as shown in the report to be taken.

3. To consider the imposition of Property Tax on Lands / Buildings in the Dacca Camtonment, at the rate of $12\frac{1}{2}\%$ under Section 60 of the Cantonments Act 1924, (II of 1924). The Municipality of Dacca has imposed HOLDING TAX, at the rate of $12\frac{1}{2}\%$ in its area.

RESOLUTION: Resolved that the proposal to impose a property tax in the Dacca Cantonment at the rate of 12½% on the annual rental value, be approved, In persuance of Section 60 of the Cantonments Act, 1924 (II of 1924). The proposal should be published for inviting objections from the inhabitants, giving 30 days notice.

4. To consider Government of Pakistan Ministry of Defence letter No. 18/4/L/D-5/54 dated 29-12-54, on the subject of permitting Cantonment Board by a Special Govt. order to develop business projects like dairies, bakeries etc. to augment the income of the Board.

RESOLUTION

The Cantonment is still in the making and no such proposal can be taken up at this stage. A civil dairy, was functioning in the Cantt. limits in the B.O.D. area; which was under acquisition. On acquisition of the land, it was recommended under the M.E.O's letter No. EPC/A/312/xy dated 15-12-54 that till the final site of the dairy is leased to the owner it was recommeded that one year lease should be given to the person, but, the Government has rejected the application under their letter No. 18/57/L/D-5/54/LCH dated 11-1-55.

The dairy is therefore, removing all its buildings and settling at Tongi. Unless the land i is allowed to be leased, on temporary basis, or other, no dairy can be encouraged. If Cault Limits

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5. To consider Government of Pakistan Ministry of Defence letter No. 26/139/G/8253/D-5/54 dated 24/28-12-54, on the question of observance of two meatless days in the Cantonment areas.

RESOLUTION: The suggestion is agreed to. This Cantonment has no meat/slaughter house of their own. No action, therefore, be taken under Section 208 of the Cantonment Act, for closer€of the same on two days in a week.

6. To consider Government of Pakistan Ministry of Defence letter No. 133/5/G/D-5/54 dated 28-12-54, calling for a a list of cases for last 3 years in which the District authorities and the courts subordinate to them, have taken no promt action for the recovery of taxes as required by section 259 of Cantts Act 1924.

RESOLUTION: Noted. The list in respect of this Cantonment is NIL.

7. To consider Govt. of Pak. Ministry of Defence letter No. 29/9/II/27/D-5/L.C.H dated 11-1-55, commenting on the Canbonment Board Proceedings for the month of Nov. 1954, put up together with draft replies in the half margin on the right hand against each item of the comment.

RESOLUTION: The draft replies to the comment as placed on the table are approved. The same may be

8. To consider the proforma for demand and collection Register to be maintained in register forma for recording the demand and collection of the professional tax.

The above proforma has been prepared on the basis of one given for water demand and collection Register. There is no exclusively.

RESCLUTION: The modified proforma as placed on the table is approved. The same now be forwarded to the Ministry of Defence for necessary sanction.

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9. To consider Government of Pakistan Ministry of Defence letter No. 26/137/G/D-5/L.C.H. dated 3rd January 1955, inviting veiws of the Cantonment Board on the subject of grant of house of the similar advances to Cantonment Fund Servants on the analogy employees.

RESOLUTION: The proposal is accepted in principle. The Board is of the opinion that the concession should be restricted to permanent servants only and the conditions for the grant of advances should be analogous to the terms on which the Government Servants.

11. In continuation to Cantonment Board Resolution No. 2 dated 13-1-55.

To consider the plan and the plinth area estimate, as put up on the table, showing the construction of Cantonment Board Primary School Building.

RESOLUTION: The Cantonment Board is of the opinion that the old plan, as placed on the table be approved as the C.P.W.D., has already prepared estimates and have approved of the same. The new middle / High school proposed in this office letter No. CBD/Genl/28/134 dated 24-1-55 can only be taken in hand if the Frovincial Government sanctions the grant-in-aid. As, there is no surety for the Provincial Government's grant-in-aid, the Cantonment Board should go ahead with the Primary School Building. The Central Government should be requested to sanction the plan telegraphically. The C.P.W.D. should be asked to call for tender immediately in anticipation of the

The sitting should be on the site now selected for the Primary / or Middle School. The siting as placed on the table is approved.

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12. To consider Government of Pakistan Ministry of Defence letter No. 40/6/LH/D-5/54 dated 27-12-54, on the question of assessment of properties within Cantonments.

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To keep the existing properties in reasonable state of repair it was necessary that assessments should be rationalised and due weight should be given to the present day high cost of labour and building material.

RESOLUTION: The Dacca Cantonment Board is in its infancy and has no Bazar Area under its management. The question, therefore, does not arise in respect of this Cantonment at the present moment.

13. To consider the leasing of shops in the Cantonment limits.

RESOLUTION: The G.O.C. (President Cantonment Board) stated that the 14 Div. is moving in Dacca Cantonment on the 15th February 1955 with their entire establishment. The only shopping centre now available is in Karwan Bazar which 3 to 4 miles away from Dacca Cantonment (Kurmitola) and therefore, it is absolutely essential that shops and markets should be opened up in the Cantonment limits without any further delay. In fact this should ke have been done atleast two years ago. The President (G.O.C 14 Div). therefore, directs that the land on the west of the Tongi road, in the community centre should be handed over to the Board immediately and a proposal to this effect should be put up to Govt. for allowing the auctioning of shop sites Cinema Hall site and etc.

A plan showing the above area, as placed on the table is approved.

The Board recommends that as a special case, the sanction of the leasing of these shops should be given, in anticipation of the formal notification as a Bazar area which will take some time. In the meantime action to notify the area should also be xx started forthwith.
